We invite you on our journey to increase the representation of Latinx Educators.

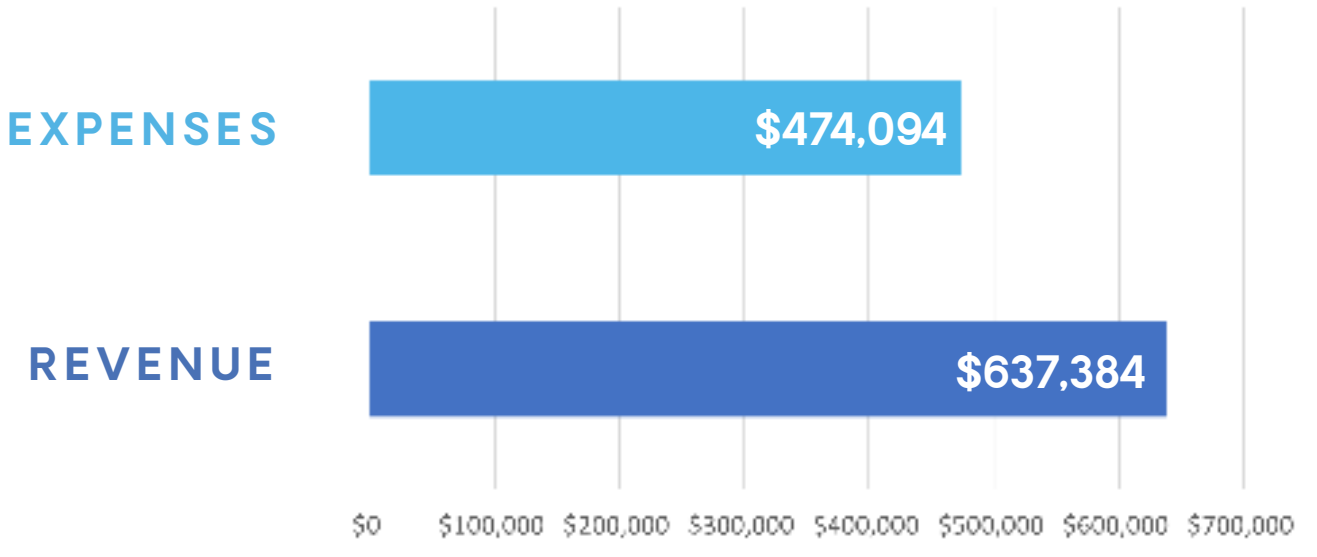

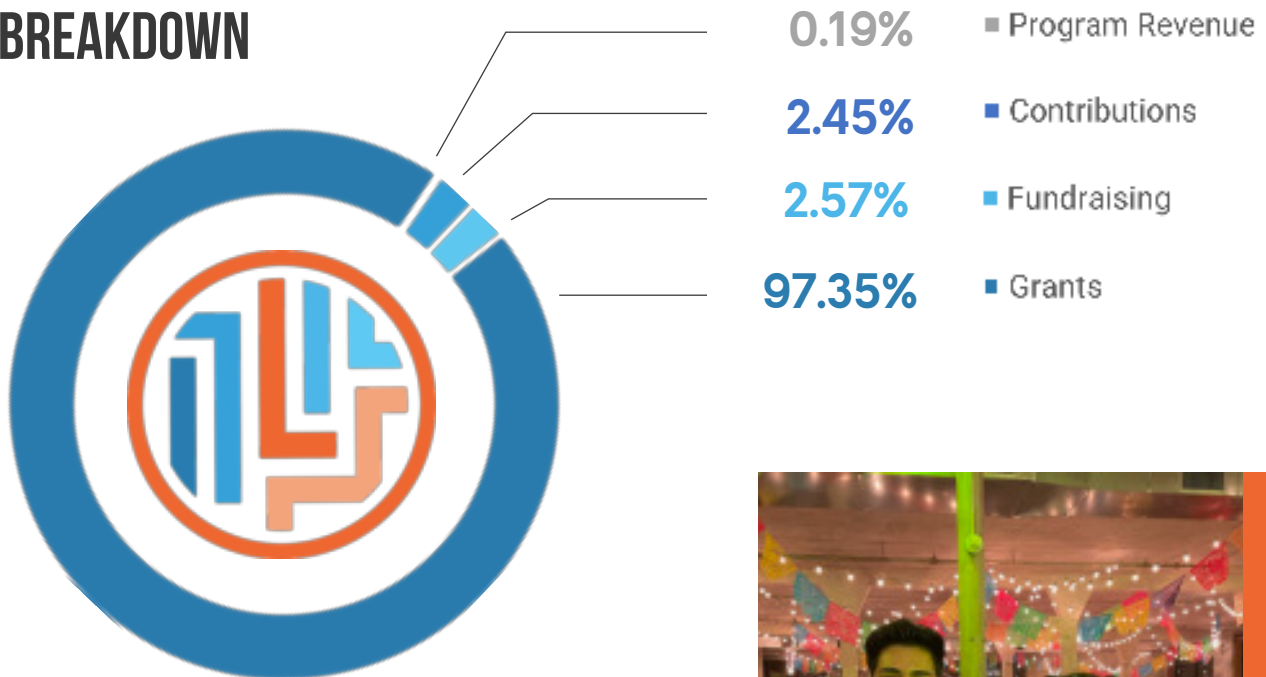

INCREASING ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

The LEC helps raise funds for future educators and connects them with vital scholarships for higher education opportunities. In 2021, the LEC partnered with Hispanic Development Fund and provided **\$10,000 in scholarships** through the Cambio para Cambio campaign. 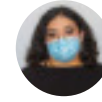
